THE MATCHUP... The two teams meet for the first time, each coming off a loss in its season opener Friday night.

ABOUT BINGHAMTON... The Bearcats gave away 14 points at the free throw line (3-for-17) and lost 71-56 to visiting Niagara three nights ago. Senior wing **Andre Heard** scored 16 points and sophomore point guard **Mike Gordon** added a career-high 13 points on 6-for-8 shooting. But the visiting Purple Eagles made 23-of-25 free throws and BU hit just 1-of-12 from three-point range.

ABOUT MT. ST. MARY'S... The Mountaineers are the first of three opponents BU will face from the Northeast Conference (St. Francis and Central Connecticut State). The Mount, which went 7-20 last season, started three freshmen in its season opener - a 74-62 loss at Virginia Tech. Senior guard **Landy Thompson** scored 18 points and freshman forward **Sam Atupem** added 13 points, but the Mountaineers dug themselves a 16-point halftime hole and lost despite outscoring the Hokies in the second half (40-36).

Bullets about Binghamton University

About the University...

- Liberal-arts based college located in Central New York approximately 70 miles south of Syracuse near the Pennsylvania border
- Outstanding academic institution which has been ranked among U.S. News & World Report's Top 50 public universities in the nation for nine consecutive years
- Part of the State University of New York system, Binghamton is one of four university centers within the system (University of Buffalo, Albany and Stony Brook are the others)
- School opened its doors in 1946 as Triple Cities College of Syracuse University

About the Athletics Program...

- Fledgling Division I program in just its sixth overall year
- Was a Division III program from its inception until 1998 when the University began its divisional upgrade through Division II (1998-2001) and finally Division I (2001-) in the America East Conference
- The 21-sport program enjoyed strong Division III success in men's soccer and wrestling in the 70s and 80s, and women's soccer, women's basketball, men's tennis and men's golf in the 90s
- As a Division I program, BU has captured 10 America East conference titles in five years of membership (men's swimming, men's tennis, men's lacrosse, men's golf, men's soccer, women's soccer, volleyball), including the women's volleyball title won Saturday night
- Binghamton athletes have maintained an overall GPA of 3.0 or higher for 11 of the last 13 semesters and have won two America East Academic Cups for achieving the highest GPA in the nine-team conference

About the Men's Basketball Program...

- BU drew national attention (USA Today, N.Y. Times) after taking North Carolina to the final buzzer in a 61-60 loss in Chapel Hill on December 16, 2001
- Bearcats recorded their first Division I postseason win last March 5, defeating Albany 76-70 in the America East quarterfinals in front of 5,222 fans in the Events Center
- Head coach Al Walker used to be the coach and athletics director at Chaminade University (1996-00), where his teams hosted the Maui Invitational each season
- In January 2004, Binghamton opened the 5,142-seat Events Center on campus, which will be the host venue for the 2006 America East Men's Basketball Championship and the 2007 America East Women's Basketball Championship

Al Walker

Head Coach

Heading into his sixth year at the helm of Binghamton's most visible sports team, Al Walker has quickly shaped his basketball program into a conference-contender while also shaping his student-athletes into community role models and well-rounded young men.

A passionate coach entering his 18th year overall, Walker has quickly transformed the Bearcats into one of the sturdiest programs in the America East Conference. After surpassing preseason expectations three straight years, his 2004-05 team earned the program's first Division I postseason victory last March, thrilling a sellout crowd of 5,222 with an inspired win over Albany in the conference quarterfinals.

Walker's commitment to recruiting talented individuals with solid character and citizenship has drawn the support of the campus and Greater Binghamton community, which have come out in record numbers to watch the Bearcats.

"It's so important that our guys are good people, work hard and recognize how special this opportunity is at Binghamton," Walker said. "We have a chance to bring pride and joy to our community."

Back in 2000 when the University hired Walker to steer its men's basketball team

into the rough waters of Division I, the school was banking on Walker's reputation for building programs from the ground up. At the same time, the administration hoped the divisional move would enhance the University's national reputation.

Thanks to aggressive recruiting and an even more aggressive team defense, Walker has made quick work of those goals.

Another constant in Walker's program has been the tradition of scheduling high-caliber opponents. In his first five years,

Walker has brought BU into battle against such nationally prominent programs as Syracuse, Kansas, North Carolina, Michigan,

Iowa State, Providence and Villanova. His team's performance against the Tar Heels in Chapel Hill on December 16, 2001, resulted in a flurry of national praise. Four days after UNC had to rally for a 61-60 win, Walker's photo graced the pages of *USA Today* above the headline "Binghamton makes its name."

Walker believes in rewarding his out-of-state players with a high-profile game back home, and thus has brought his team up against teams from the Big East, Big 12 and ACC in recent years. This season is no exception, as the Bearcats will travel to the Sooner state to play perennial NCAA team Oklahoma University and also play in the Utah State Holiday Classic for the benefit of seniors Andre Heard and Schafer Jackson, respectively.

Walker was introduced at a press conference on March 16, 2000. A unanimous selection among the University's advisory committee, Walker became the 10th coach in Binghamton's 55 years of basketball — and the first with Division I coaching experience.

"Al Walker had the breadth of experience we were looking for," said Joel Thirer, director of health, physical education and athletics. "He has coached at the Division I level, and has recruited and taught student-athletes that fit our University's elite academic profile. Al is well respected across the country, and we are confident he will build our program the same way he has done in the past."

Building a Winner

Under the tutelage of sixth-year head coach Al Walker, the Binghamton University men's basketball program is embarking on a meteoric rise in the ranks of Division I basketball in the America East Conference. All eyes have quickly been drawn to the Bearcats, who surpassed expectations in each of their first three years and are now poised to challenge for the conference championship. With aggressive marketing, administrative support and a fan base that is unmatched in the nine-team league, Binghamton has quickly emerged as the program of the future.

Playing in a Palace

From the inaugural game at the Events Center in January 2004 to the highly-successful 2005 America East Championship, fans have flocked to the \$33.1 million state-of-the-art basketball arena to cheer on the Bearcats. Binghamton has led the entire conference in home attendance in each of the last two seasons.

Hosting the Conference Championship again

On the heels of its successful host role for the 2005 America East Men's Basketball Championship, Binghamton was promptly awarded the 2006 championship and will welcome the conference and its fan base to campus on March 3-5.

Last March, Binghamton hosted the first three rounds of the championship and drew 15,977 fans - more than double the attendance from the 2004 event. The quarterfinal session attendance of 8,284 on March 5 was the third-highest figure in conference tournament history.

Buoyed by the big home crowds, BU defeated fourth-seeded Albany in the quarterfinals in front of 5,222 fans and then brilliantly battled eventual champion Vermont before falling in the semifinals.

Maximum Exposure

The Bearcats have already gained regional and national exposure - thanks to marquis players, strong scheduling and broadcast exposure. Binghamton has increased its national profile with an appearance in the preseason NIT and recent games against NCAA powers Syracuse, Kansas, Villanova and North Carolina. The Bearcats will travel across the country to face elite programs again in 2005-06. A matchup with perennial NCAA tournament team Oklahoma and a holiday tournament at 2005 NCAA tournament team Utah State highlight the schedule.

Binghamton has been equally aggressive in the media market, where the school secured a conference-best four televised games in 2004-05, in addition to offering all 29 home and away games on live radio that was streamed on the internet.



Role Models

Binghamton basketball coaches and players reach out to the community throughout the year. The team hosts free clinics, visits community schools and makes young children an integral part of every game night. Through their athletic and academic achievement, sportsmanship and community service, the Bearcats are positive role models for kids of all ages.

The Place to Be

With four starters back, a highly-touted recruiting class on its way, a jammed Events Center atmosphere on campus, and the conference tournament returning to town, clearly the best is yet to come in 2005-06.
