Explanation of Costs:

Please review the following information carefully.

Food and Housing

Costs vary for housing and meal plans according to selection. The costs given are for a standard double room in the residential colleges and for a standard meal plan. A student may choose a more expensive housing option (break housing in the residential colleges, a room in the Mountainview Community, or a room in an apartment community such as Hillside or Susquehanna Communities). Meal plans are not required for students who are housed in Susquehanna or Hillside Communities. **Students who are 22 years old or older may not live in the residential colleges. They may live in either the Hillside or Susquehanna Communities, or off campus.** Information on off-campus housing can be found online at <http://occ.binghamton.edu>. except specifically designated break housing areas close during official university breaks and vacation periods. Students not living in break housing (or the Hillside and Susquehanna Communities) are obligated to find alternative housing during these periods. Many students choose to travel at this time. The cost of travel and alternative housing during the breaks is not factored into this estimate of costs and should be considered by the student when determining a budget for personal expenses. Health Insurance

The SUNY health insurance fee is \$79.25 per month. The cost for the fall semester is \$396.25 for five months. The cost for the spring semester is \$554.75 for seven months, and includes coverage through the summer. However, students leaving earlier may receive a partial refund upon presentation of proof (in the form of an airline ticket) of earlier departure. Refunds will be mailed to the student's home address after the end of the term.

Fees

Fees covered by the exchange program include the activity fee and comprehensive fee. Some courses have a laboratory or equipment fee, which is the responsibility of the student.

Orientation

The fall orientation fee is \$290.00 for undergraduate students living on campus, \$190 for undergraduates living off campus and \$100 for graduate students.

***Pricing**

All pricing information is based on 2007-2008 rates plus a 5% expected increase. (Fees, meal plan, housing and health insurance costs may increase by 5% for 2008-2009.) Any increases will be made over the summer, so you will have little notice to make actual adjustments, therefore the expected increase, though not confirmed, has been factored in.

Exchange students are required to show proof of financial resources equivalent to \$6,600 for the semester, or \$13,200 for the year, on the State University of New York Foreign Student Financial Statement.
