Only courses passed with a grade of C- or better may count towards major requirements • Only ONE (1) course taken under the Pass/Fail option may count towards major requirements • A maximum of 8 credits total is allowed of any ANTH 293/393/493, and ANTH 495 (4cr max.) and 497/499 (4cr max.) courses. ANTH 491 may not be counted toward the B.S. major requirements • A total of 68 credits are required for completion of the B.S. in Anthropology, of which a minimum of 28 credits must be taken in Anthropology at Binghamton University.
