Minor Requirements (24 credits)

A	ONE foundations course in Archaeology (4 cr.), either "Introduction to Prehistoric Archaeology" (ANTH 167) or "Historical Archaeology" (ANTH 169)	ANTH 167/169
В	TWO archaeological area courses (8 cr.) chosen from among ANTH 260-269, 340-344, 370, 374-379. ¹	
С	TWO upper level archaeology courses (8 cr.) chosen from among ANTH 340-348, 372-379, 470-475. ² A maximum of 4 credits total of any combination of ANTH 393/493/497/499 is allowed; ANTH 491 is not allowed.	
D	ONE elective course (4 cr.) in any subfield of Anthropology or in a related social science, chosen in consultation with the Director of Undergraduate Studies. ³ ANTH 491 is not allowed.	

Only courses passed with a grade of C- or better may count towards minor requirements • No courses taken pass/fail may count towards minor requirements • No more than one course for the minor may be a cross-listing based in another Department • A total of 24 credits are required for completion of this minor, of which at least 12 credits must be taken in Anthropology at Binghamton University
