### Minor Requirements

A	ONE foundations course in Biological Anthropology (4 cr.), "Introduction to Biological Anthropology" (ANTH 168)	ANTH 168
B	THREE courses in Biological Anthropology (12 cr.) taken at the 300 level or above, and chosen from among ANTH 330-339, 420-429, 380/480 (with a biological anthropology focus). <sup>1</sup> A maximum of 4 credits total of any combination of ANTH 393/493/497/499 is allowed; ANTH 491 is not allowed.	
C	ONE elective lower-level course (4 cr.) in Biological Anthropology, chosen from among ANTH 240-249, 280 (with a biological anthropology focus). <sup>2</sup>	
D	ONE elective course (4 cr.) in any subfield of Anthropology or in a cognate field in the social sciences or natural sciences <sup>3</sup> , to be chosen in consultation with the Director of Undergraduate Studies. ANTH 490-495 is not allowed.	

- Only courses passed with a grade of C- or better may count towards minor requirements
- No courses taken under the Pass/Fail option may count towards minor requirements
- A total of 24 credits are required for completion of this minor, of which at least 12 credits must be taken in Anthropology at Binghamton University

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### Future Planning:

<sup>1/</sup> Some semesters upper-level topics courses (380x/480x) may be offered that meet the Category "B" requirement. A maximum of 4 credits of Anth 393/493 are allowed.

<sup>2/</sup> Some semesters lower-level topics courses (280x) may be offered that meet the Category "C" requirement.

<sup>3/</sup> Cognate fields of the social or natural sciences may include Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Studies, Geography, Geology, Physics and Psychology.
