Minor Requirements

A	TWO foundations courses in Linguistic Anthropology (8 cr.), “Language, Culture and Communication in the U.S.” (Anth 114), “Introduction to Linguistic Structures” (Anth 118), and “Introduction to Linguistic Anthropology” (ANTH 170).	114/170	118
B	ONE 200 level course (4 cr.) in Linguistic Anthropology. Choose among ANTH 210-219 or ANTH 280 topics courses (with a linguistic anthropology focus).		
C	TWO 300/400 level courses in Linguistic Anthropology (8 cr.). Choose from ANTH 310-329, 410, 440-449 or ANTH 380/480 topics courses (with a linguistic anthropology focus). A maximum 4 credits total of any combination of ANTH 393/493/497/499 is allowed.		
D	ONE elective course (4 cr.) taken at any level and in any subfield of Anthropology or the other social sciences, to be chosen in consultation with the Director of Undergraduate Studies. ¹ ANTH 491 is not allowed.		

• Only courses passed with a grade of C- or better may count towards minor requirements • No courses taken pass/fail will count towards minor requirements • Of the courses taken for the minor, no more than three may be at the 100 level • Only one cross-listed course may be counted towards minor requirements (normally Category “D”). A total of 24 credits are required for completion of this minor, of which at least 12 credits must be taken in Anthropology at Binghamton University
