## Minor in Sociocultural Anthropology

### Minor Requirements

| A | ONE foundations course in Sociocultural Anthropology (4 cr.), "Introduction to Sociocultural Anthropology" (ANTH 166).  | ANTH 166 |
| B | ONE area course (4 cr.) in Sociocultural Anthropology focused on the peoples/cultures of a specific world region or area (e.g., the Pacific, Middle East, Southeast Asia, North Africa, etc). Choose among ANTH 250-259, 273, 367-370. <sup>1</sup>   |          |
| C | THREE 300/400 level courses in Sociocultural Anthropology (12 cr.). Choose from ANTH 300, 349-359, 360-369, 450-459, 460-465, 477 as well as ANTH 380/480 topics courses (anthropology courses with a sociocultural focus). <sup>2</sup> A maximum 4 credits total of any combination of ANTH 393/493/497/499 is allowed. |          |

| D | ONE elective course (4 cr.) taken at any level and in any subfield of Anthropology or the other social sciences, to be chosen in consultation with the Director of Undergraduate Studies. <sup>3</sup> ANTH 491 is not allowed.   |          |

• Only courses passed with a grade of C- or better may count towards minor requirements • No courses taken pass/fail will count towards minor requirements • Of the courses taken for the minor, no more than two may be at the 100 level • Only one cross-listed course may be counted towards minor requirements (normally Category "D"). A total of 24 credits are required for completion of this minor, of which at least 12 credits must be taken in Anthropology at Binghamton University
