When we consider two "things" we say of them, relatively, that either they are different or they are alike.


Now wherein lies this difference or wherein lies this similarity?


Perhaps there may even be a point at which things become neither different nor similar.


Sometimes difference may be more apparent than real. Sometimes difference could be more real than apparent.

Sometimes similarity could be more real than apparent. Sometimes similarity may be more apparent than real.


