



"A bulls-eye accuracy of hand and insight characterizes the work of Jeff Low. Whether he observes the object directly or draws upon his inner faculties, the resultant work possesses a handsomeness of touch — a rare quality today and especially so in young artists.

For Low the artistic performance is a generous outpouring of what appears to be an unlimited reservoir of visual ideas. The ideas range from design caricatures of the human frame, never sly and always sympathetic, to expressive manipulation of forms, figures or landscapes, to large-scale epic notions such as the cumulative anguish of a tortured people. Whatever the case may be, the nature of the chosen medium is always respected and exploited with sensitivity.

Jeff Low's decision to live and work in Binghamton is a good one. Having studied both at home and abroad, he acknowledges his heritage. He knows that his roots can sink deep and is not deceived by the glitter of exotic leaves on a dry stem."
