## Introduction

"The field of collecting is a never ending joy and excitement. An aspect of it is definitely in the area of detective work, such as tracking down the identity of the artist and the pedigree of the painting."

With these words Mr. and Mrs. J. O'Connor Lynch from New York City generously consented to let us share their love for these works collected over forty years; and in this spirit we gratefully present this exhibition, with pleasure and pride, to our University community, to our friends in the Binghamton area and to our colleagues and scholars.


It seems proper to bring this collection to a University center, particularly in view of the fact that, excepting a few already exhibited works from this group, the large part of the assembled paintings, drawings and sculpture, was never shown before publicly. It is true that in these long years of collecting many have had the pleasure of seeing these works in the hospitable home of our generous lenders, but they were never exposed to a larger audience.

The most striking point in this exhibition is the breadth of appreciation and the range and scope of this selection: sixteenth, seventeenth, eighteenth and nineteenth centuries; Italy, France, Germany, England, Spain and America. A beautiful small drawing by Cambiaso, an important and monumental Strozzi, a van Dyck, a sculpture by Clodion—what a diversity and an unorthodox taste.

The attributions in most of the cases were those suggested by Mr. Lynch; descriptive material in the catalogue notes has been kept to a minimum and bibliographical notes have been compiled as completely as possible.

With gratitude we acknowledge the assistance of the Graduate Student Organization which financial contribution made possible the publication of this catalogue in its present form. Elizabeth Van Horn and Walter Luckert have helped in many ways to make this project a successful one.








