
Lucia Chang, Untitled, charcoal on paper, 25  $\times$  20 inches






David Thurlow, Untitled, monotype, 25 imes 18 inches








Sheldon Mukamal, Building on Fire, steel, 80 imes 44 imes 32 inches













Marguerite Lutton, Jimmy Love, oil on canvas, 49 × 60 inches









Tammie J. DePalma, Still Life, pencil, 24 imes 18 inches
















Karen Legg, Portrait of Model, charcoal, 40  $\times$  32 inches
