The studio art faculty presents a curriculum that provides a broad background in the visual arts, leading to a BA or BFA degree. The program offers training in drawing, design, painting, sculpture, and printmaking.

There are ten members of the studio faculty, all of whom are practicing artists or designers. Each has brought to Harpur College established professional associations and careers that continue to progress. Work by the studio faculty is consistently included in gallery and museum exhibitions, many of which are solo presentations.


The studio art facilities at Binghamton are recognized as some of the finest available. The individual studios are well equipped and all are either new or recently and extensively renovated and refurbished. They include spacious painting and drawing studios, printmaking workshops with new etching and lithography presses, and up-to-date design studios. The program also offers a computer graphics center, new sculpture, power shop, and foundry facilities, and a departmental studio art gallery.

In 1987, the studio art program received a generous visiting artist endowment from Dr. Israel J. Rosefsky in memory of his wife, Elsie Benensohn Rosefsky. This endowment enabled us to expand our Visiting Artist Program.
