





Untitled, etching, 5¾'' × 7¾''



Untitled, green soapstone, 5½"h × 7½"w × 9"d



Recycling Poster, computer generated, 30" × 40"



Portrait, oil on canvas







Untitled, pastel on paper, 44" × 30"










Theresa Voellinger Figure study, oil on canvas


