# Studio Art Program

The studio art faculty presents a curriculum that provides a broad background in the visual arts, leading to a BA or BFA degree. The program offers training in drawing, graphic design, painting, sculpture, and printmaking.

All ten members of the studio faculty are practicing artists or designers. Each has brought to Harpur College established professional associations and careers that continue to progress. The fine-arts and design faculty are working, exhibiting artists who are represented in group and solo shows throughout the country.

The studio art facilities at Binghamton are recognized as some of the finest available. Individual studios are well equipped and either new or recently and extensively renovated and refurbished. They include spacious painting and drawing studios, printmaking workshops with new etching and lithography presses, and up-to-date design studios. Other facilities include a computer graphics center, new sculpture and power shops, foundry facilities, and the Elsie Benensohn Rosefsky Studio Art Gallery.

A generous endowment from Dr. Israel J. Rosefsky in memory of his wife, Elsie Benensohn Rosefsky, supports an extensive visiting-artist program.

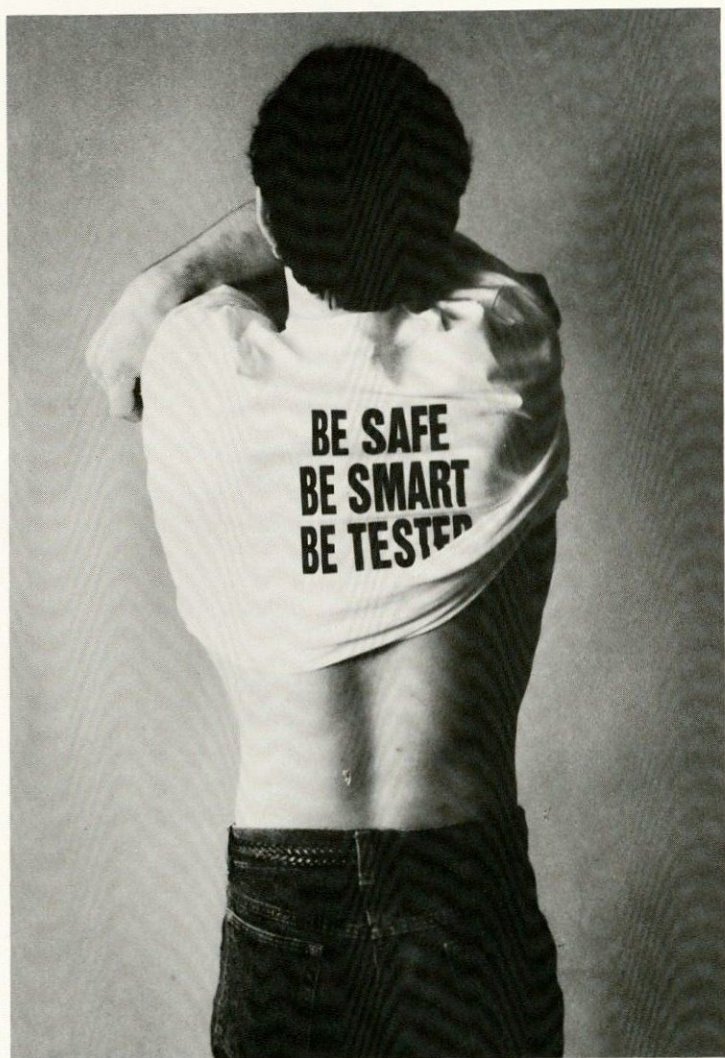
We would also like to thank the capable adjunct faculty who have joined us in recent months. Their help is critical in sustaining our program.

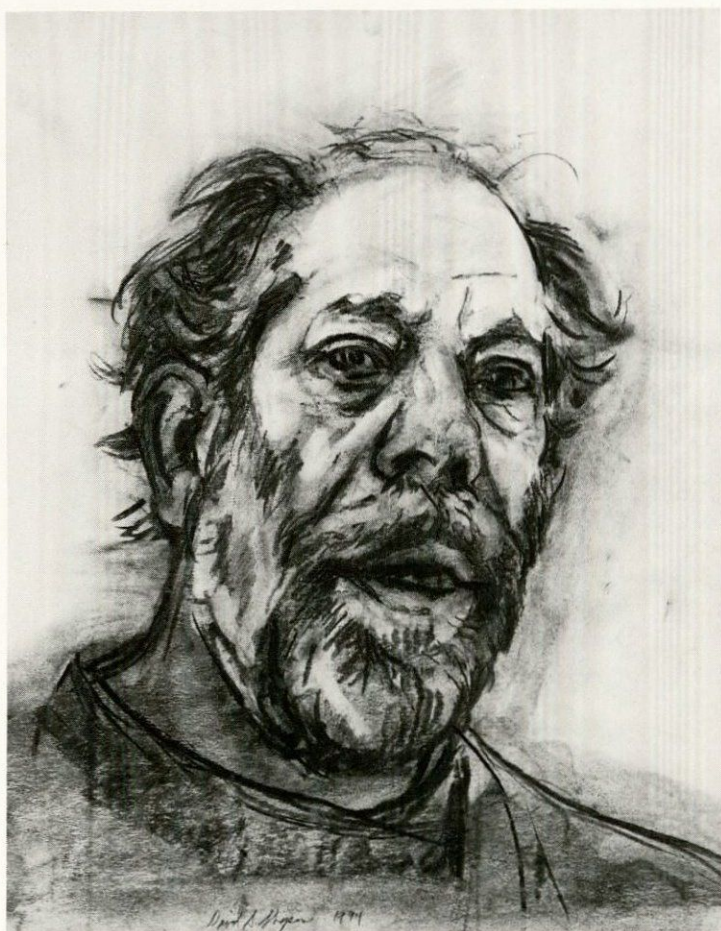

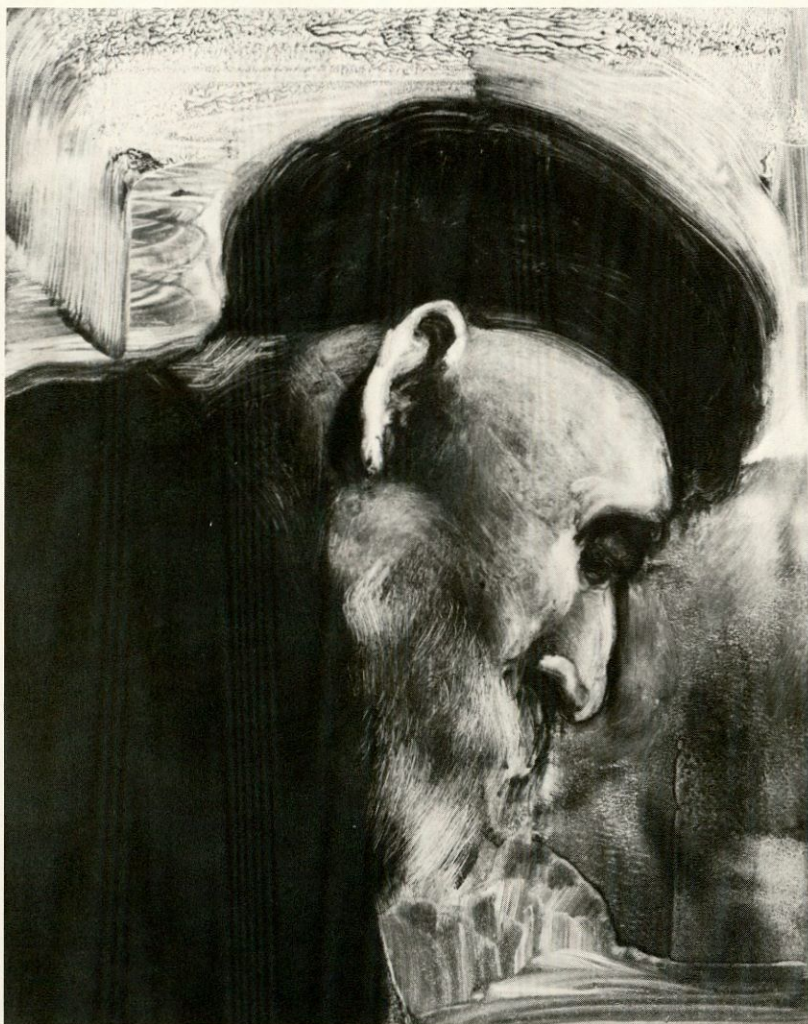
