





t's the rite of spring for the University studio art world. A summation, the time when we come closest to seeing it all together, as opposed to the bits and pieces we see on a daily basis, and it feels good. It always does. For twenty years I've stood here with little groups of faculty amid the clutter and chaos as the show goes up and felt immersed in the year's effort, student and faculty, as at no other time.

It's never been a highly selective show, and this is by design. There is as much here as space allows, maybe a bit more. We've always thought it best to err on the side of too much work than too little, the better to saturate the viewer in the whole, as opposed to the individual. Of course there is a price to pay in terms of proper display of individual pieces of art, but it's worth it.

The show is probably skewed toward the more polished and sophisticated work, usually, but emphatically not always, of the more experienced students. But a determined effort is made to include work of beginning classes, and those pieces that show promise through a rough surface. It's a display of a process, not a final, or even tentative, result. This is fundamentally a growth experience, and in some of these works there is a sense of the pain that is inherent in this growth. It is rarely, if ever, smooth, confident, fully formed. It's the start of something that will never be "finished."

Like all spring rites, it's about beginning.



KAWAI CHU Aspiring From Grey oil on canvas 78 x 42"




BECCA MENT 21st Century Gravestone bronze 6 x 4 x 2 ½"




SIO WAI TSUI Untitled wood 12 x 12 x 6"

JO LAINE GEE Noah's Ark oil on canvas 82 x 90"



CHRISTIAN BILL The Rarest Rose oil on masonite 30 x 30"




KIRSTEN MORAN *Jeremiah*conte drawing

TAMI TOLPA Corpse #1 etching 91/8 x 121/4"




SARA CRIVELLO *Photo Display* mixed media




VICTOR CALIMAN *Untitled* hard-ground etching 15½ x 11½"

ERIN RODAT *Untitled* mixed media 40 x 26"




Nude Study


