



human motivation. Everything we do is for one or the other of these, or occasionally

both, but it's universally accepted that the stuff done for love is better. Higher quality.

And it's this quality that makes the Student Show exciting. The walls are covered with

work done for love. (BU students are far too bright to be involved with art for the

money.) So it has to be love.

We as faculty run into this quality in the work of individual students all the time (or at

least some of the time), and these times are the payoff for this job. (We didn't go into

art for the money either.) So the Student Show, where we see a collective output for

the whole year, is sort of an annual payday for the faculty. The excitement of the

involvement with quality for both student and faculty certainly shows on these walls. It

shows, in some cases, despite skills still only partially developed, or ideas that have not

yet had time to mature; but it shows. Student work, while often exciting, is really about

promise, but the quality of a "labor of love" is often evident even at this early stage of

development. This promise is the real excitement.














