

TEACH Grant Request for Review

The Teacher Education Assistance for College and Higher Education (TEACH) Grant Program offers up to \$4,000 per year for students planning to teach full-time in high-need subject areas at schools serving low-income families.

Eligibility at Binghamton University:

- Only graduate-level programs qualify for TEACH Grant funds.
- Part-time students may apply, but the grant amount will be reduced (see the TEACH web page for details).

Steps to Apply for the TEACH Grant:

To be considered for and awarded the TEACH Grant, complete the following steps **each year** you wish to receive funding:

- Review the [TEACH Grant award amounts and policies](#).
- Complete the [Free Application for Federal Student Aid \(FAFSA\)](#) for the academic year you wish to receive the TEACH Grant.
- Complete the **2025-2026** [TEACH Grant Entrance Counseling](#) at studentaid.gov.
- Complete the **2025-2026** [TEACH Grant Agreement to Serve or Repay](#) at studentaid.gov.
- Complete the student portion of the **Academic Eligibility** section on page 2 and meet with a representative in the Department of Teaching, Learning, and Educational Leadership.
