Creating a Professional Profile

Letting the world—potential collaborators and employers as well as other scholars in your field—know who you are and what you have to offer can help jump-start your career. The Binghamton University Libraries support an open repository—the ORB (**Open Repository** @ **Binghamton University**)—that allows faculty and graduate students to share their profile and research with scholars around the world. That profile can be easily linked with students' profile on the Department's graduate student page.

In April of 2025, the Libraries changed the software used to make profiles from Expert Gallery/Selected Works Gallery to ORCID. Tutorials on how to make a profile on the new system can be found at https://info.orcid.org/video-tutorials/. Students who had a profile on the ORB developed with Selected Works Gallery were notified to transition to the new system once operational; they had until December 2024 to complete this task.

Distinguish yourself and your research with ORCID

ORCID provides a persistent digital identifier that distinguishes you from every other researcher and, through integration in key research workflows such as manuscript and grant submission, supports automated linkages between you and your professional activities, ensuring that your work is recognized.
