The Major in Judaic Studies

The Major in Judaic Studies consists of 10 courses and language proficiency, in the following categories. No course can count for more than one category.

Three Core Courses

--	--	--

Ancient (origins to 539 BCE), Between the Persians and Islam (to 636 CE), Medieval (to 14th century), Renaissance and Early Modern (to 18th century), Modern (to the present)

Four Area Courses

These are courses that cluster together to form an area of study of the student's choice. Possibly Areas of Study include Jewish History, Jewish Thought, Jewish Social Service, Holocaust Studies, Literature and Culture, and others.

Three Elective Courses

--	--	--

These must include any 2 courses at the 300-400 level either (a) in Judaic Studies or (b) cross-listed in Judaic Studies, including language courses.

Language Proficiency

Either (a) HEBR 204 or (b) HEBR 203 and a Yiddish course. If one places out of the language proficiency requirement, one must take an additional elective.
