#### Notes:

- 1. Only courses above HEBR 102 count toward the minor.
- 2. At least two of the courses have to be in the 300-400 level.

- 4. Courses in Yiddish language and literature may be counted toward the Hebrew minor.
- 5. No course with a grade lower than C and no P/F courses can be counted toward the Hebrew minor.

#### Notes:

- 1. Minors at Binghamton University require six 4-credit courses (24 credits).
- 2. Half of the courses for the minor must at the 300 or 400 level.
- 3. A minimum of four courses (16 credits) must be independent of any other major or minor. So, only two courses can overlap with a major or a different minor.
- 4. At least 3 courses used for the minor must be taken at Binghamton University.
- 5. Students who pass the test of language proficiency in either Hebrew or Arabic will be required to substitute 2 courses for the language requirement.
