THE EXCHANGE PROGRAM AT BINGHAMTON

In a little over 70 years, Binghamton University has built a reputation as a world-class institution with an international perspective that combines a broadly interdisciplinary, international education with one of the most vibrant research programs in the nation. Exchange students are directly enrolled into the university and are included in all campus activities. Undergraduate students may live on or off campus, as they choose, however undergraduates are especially encouraged to live on campus to be a part of the residential community life, a big part of undergraduate culture at Binghamton. The Exchange Team in International Education and Global Initiatives is there to offer advice and support.

THE SETTING

Binghamton University is located in the Southern Tier of upstate New York, just one mile west of the city of Binghamton and a short drive from major urban centers in New York and neighboring states, as well as Canada. Greater Binghamton is a region rich in scenic beauty, enchanting villages and lively cities. The campus is spread across 930 acres on a wooded hillside above the Susquehanna River, and the on-campus Nature Preserve boasts 190 acres of protected forest and wetlands with hiking/biking/running trails and a six-acre pond.

The area offers countless outdoor recreational opportunities along with coffee houses, concerts, restaurants, shopping malls, the beauty of having four seasons and a safe and friendly community. Students will find a sophisticated cultural life with theaters, a professional opera company, a symphony orchestra, museums, a planetarium and an observatory, the Ross Park Zoo, as well as thrilling spectator sports including the Binghamton Rumble Ponies minor league baseball team, AHL Binghamton Black Bears, and NCAA Division I (collegiate) Basketball and other sports.

The university, with a student population of 18,454 (14,408 undergraduates, 4,046 graduate students) prides itself on resembling a first-rate private university – rigorous, collaborative and boldly innovative – while the campus culture exemplifies the best kind of public university experience: richly diverse students, active social life and deep engagement with the community.

Binghamton University is ranked by the Carnegie Classification of Institutions of Higher Education as an “R1” (very high research” institution — one of only 146 in the nation.
