### Estimated Costs of Study at Binghamton On a Tuition and Fees Exchange For an Undergraduate Student 2025-2026

Binghamton University provides for full-time student tuition (12 or more credit hours) and regular semester billable fees.

The student is responsible for paying:

## **Food and Housing**

Costs vary for housing and meal plans according to selection, and these are estimates. The costs given are for a double room in a Residential College (in Hinman College or College in the Woods) and for a standard (level C) meal plan for the 2024-2025 academic year +5% estimated increase for 2025-26.

A student may choose a more expensive housing option (for instance, a single room in an apartment community such as Hillside or Susquehanna Communities). Meal plans are not required for students who are housed in Susquehanna or Hillside Communities.

**Students who are 22 years old or older may not live in the residential colleges. They may live in either the Hillside or Susquehanna Communities, or off campus.** Information on off-campus housing can be found online at <http://occ.binghamton.edu>. Many students opt to travel on weekends and breaks. The cost of travel and alternative housing during the breaks is not factored into this estimate of costs and should be considered by the student when determining a budget for personal expenses.

## **Health Insurance**

The SUNY health insurance fee was \$211.03 per month for 2024-2025. The costs given are the 2024-25 rate +5% estimated increase for 2025-26. The charge for the insurance will appear on your semester bill.

## **Fees**

Fees covered by the exchange program include the regular semester billable fees. Some courses have a laboratory, equipment, activities, or supplies fee, which is the responsibility of the student. The New Student Fee is a one-time charge applied to every student and will be charged to your student account bill. It covers the cost of the mandatory orientation. The International Student Fee is charged to each international student each semester and covers the cost of administering the SEVIS immigration requirements at Binghamton.

## **Orientation**

In addition to the Exchange welcome and orientation activities, incoming exchange students are required to attend the International Student and New Student Orientations, held by the office of International Student & Scholar Services and Student Affairs. The New Student Fee is \$220 for all incoming undergraduate exchange students.

## **Pricing**

Prices are based on the 2024-2025 academic year +5% estimated increase and are subject to change without notice.
