The Physician Alumni Lecture Series, *A Day in the Life*, gives students the opportunity to hear from alumni physicians representing a vast array of specialties. A question and answer session will follow the talk.

Dr. Alexandra Isakova '04, will discuss her path from Binghamton, through medical school to her current career as a Family Medicine Doctor at The Floating Hospital Clinic.

Dr. Isakova earned her bachelor's degree in psychobiology from Binghamton University in 2004. She earned her master's degree in biological sciences from Drexel University and attended the Philadelphia College of Osteopathic Medicine. She completed her residency in Family Medicine at Boston University Medical Center.

Currently, Dr. Isakova is a physician at The Floating Hospital clinic, which has been around for 150 years serving the underserved. Originally a hospital on a ship, after 9/11, the Hospital, was forced to "dock" and the ship was split into different clinics and shelter clinics. The main headquarters of The Floating Hospital in Long Island City, NY serves shelters from all 5 boroughs of NYC and also has a community health center. Dr. Isakova primarily works at the community health center doing full spectrum Family Medicine. Her concentration is women's health including IUD's and colposcopies, skin procedures and basic osteopathic manipulation. In addition, Dr. Isakova has covered 3 NYC marathons working in the finish tents.
