Reignite Road Map Funds \$115,000 per year for two years awarded to SP4


- Fund faculty stipends/grants for community-engaged teaching/scholarship

- Conference (Research Days 2023)




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Collaboratory: What is Collaboratory?

- Designed to tell stories, not just track numeric metrics





Collaboratory: Timeline & rollout

Fall 2021 - Summer 2022: Acquired platform, completed setup and onboarding, published CCE activities

Fall 2022: "Soft launch", building activities base with other offices/programs in Division of Student Affairs and faculty engaged with CCE

Spring 2023-Summer 2023: "Soft launch", expanding activities base in preparation for official launch

Fall 2023: Official announcement and launch of platform






Goal 1 metrics over time

Supports for Goal 1 Metrics

- Consulting for faculty interested in community-engaged teaching and scholarship CCE Faculty Engagement Associate and other staff
- Ongoing professional development for faculty with CLT
- Course development stipends (new with SP4 funding)
 - 9 awarded in 2021–22 (\$1,000 each)
 - 4 awarded so far in 2022-23 (\$1,000 each)
- Grants for community-engaged teaching and scholarship (expanded with SP4 funding)
 - 6 awarded in 2021–22 (\$11,200 total)
 - 19 awarded so far in 2022-23 (\$36,000 total)
- Engaged Faculty Fellowship Program 6 fellows per year





Students enrolled in designated community-engaged learning courses






Class of 2022 Community-Engaged Learning Participation by Race


Student voting rates (presidential elections)





Field of study




Historically high turnout




Goal 3: Binghamton University staff and faculty volunteer in their communities.

- Staff service (% of staff responding to PSS survey Fall 2022)


Note: Survey distribution changed from 2020-21 to 2021-22. % of staff decreased, but there was an increase in the total number of staff reporting service



Staff Service Survey: Barriers to service

All staff, regardless of whether they participated in service/volunteer commitments in the 2021-2022 year or not, were asked about obstacles to service.

The most reported obstacles are a lack of personal time, times for opportunities not aligning with free time and a lack of knowledge about opportunities.

"To what extent did collaboration with Binghamton University positively impact or advance your mission/goals?"





Carnegie Engagement Classification

- Requires a culture of engagement that is reflected through institutional mission, identity and commitments
- Evidence-based documentation of institutional practices to be used in a process of self-assessment and quality improvement





2021: Classification shifts to 2-year cycle. Campuses retain the classification for a 6-year period and then must apply for reclassification.

2026: Classification announcements




