-Enroll fall and spring of internship year (usually, just 1 credit).

PSYC 698: Pre-dissertation Research (variable credits)

-Enroll after successfully passing 2<sup>nd</sup>-year project until passing prelims.

PSYC 699: Dissertation Research (variable credits)

-Enroll in this course following successfully passing prelims and until your dissertation defense

-Satisfactory completion of a doctoral dissertation is required for the Ph.D.

Note: At least one credit of Psysc 596, 599, 698, or 699 must be completed for each semester in residence (i.e., pre-internship).
