Academic component: choose from diverse community-engaged, service-learning courses, in Human Development (HDEV), Social Work (SW), Public Administration (PAFF), Women, Gender, and Sexuality Studies (WGSS), a CDCI Internship with a community non-profit organization, and others

VOLUNTEER!

Service component: a minimum of 15 service hours each semester. Can be fulfilled by the hours done in one of your courses, through service projects organized by PSLC and other Hinman leaders, or through service projects done independently

PARTICIPATE!

Participation component: participate in organized PSLC service projects, field trips, discussion groups, and plenary meetings featuring guest speakers from the Binghamton community

Additional Opportunities:

- A "Day Away" at the start of the fall semester, with a service project and community builders
- Shared summer reading, discussed in small PSLC groups during the fall semester
- Field trip downtown for First-Friday on September 1, led by Hinman's Collegiate Professor
- Keep track of service hours and activities on the ALIVE Points website
- Celebrate a year of service and community engagement in Hinman at the annual ALIVE Community Partners dinner
- Earn a Certificate for *Outstanding Achievement in Public Service*, through activities over and above the minimum requirements for PSLC residents
