**General Education requirements may be taken in any sequence. The GenEd sequence shown above is just one example.**

**Non-Management electives** may be chosen from any subject area other than business/management. Liberal arts (Harpur College) coursework typically makes up the majority of these credits, but Computer Science (CS) or other non-liberal arts courses are also acceptable.

\* Students must take three writing emphasis (C or J) courses to fulfill the writing requirement. One of these will also satisfy the GenEd Language & Communications requirement. "J" courses fulfill both a GenEd “C” and an "O" requirement.

\*\* SOM students may register for Math 147, Math 148, Econ 366 or Psych 243 in place of the recommended CQS 112 to satisfy the statistics requirement, but may not take more than one of these 5 statistics courses towards the degree. None of these courses qualifies as a non-intro non-mgmt course.

\*\*\* Students in the PwC Scholars must enroll in the Honors seminar for each semester they are in the program and in residence.

\*\*\*\* **MS admission is not guaranteed. Minimum GPA of 3.0. Minimum GMAT score of 580. Applications are submitted in Fall of senior year. A special Early Admissions period is available in the early Fall of the senior year for those with 3.4+ GPA’s which does not require the GMAT.**

PwC Scholars program students must complete either a minor in Harpur College (usually 6 courses), a secondary concentration in SOM (4 courses) or an additional course in the primary concentration. This may require one or more additional courses beyond the normal 126 credits required to graduate.
