**Students enrolled in the PwC Scholars Program must be enrolled in an Honors Seminar each semester they are in the program and in residence.

***PwC Scholars program students must complete either a minor in Harpur College (typically 6 courses), a secondary concentration in SOM (4 courses) or an additional course in the primary concentration. This may require one or more additional courses beyond the normal 126 credit requirement to graduate.

****All students are required to have at least 45 credits in 300 or 400 level classes. PwC scholars are required to have taken an experiential learning course in addition to their concentration requirements or have a minor or have a 2nd concentration or double degree in a major in one of the other colleges at Binghamton University and these are permitted to count towards the 45 Upper Division credits
