Use accessibility features with Gmail

You can use common accessibility features with Gmail, like screen readers and TalkBack.

Computer

You can use accessibility features with Gmail in standard view or basic HTML view.

- **Standard View:** Has more features and functionality, and is the default view for <u>most</u> commonly used browsers.
- Basic HTML view: Used for browsers that aren't supported by Gmail.

Android

You can use <u>Android accessibility features with Gmail</u>, including the TalkBack screen reader, screen magnification, and more.

Use TalkBack

Step 1: Turn on TalkBack

If TalkBack isn't already turned on for your Android device, visit <u>learn how to turn on</u> TalkBack.

Step 2: Use TalkBack

Once you've turned on TalkBack, you can navigate in Gmail using standard TalkBack navigation gestures.

- Two-finger swipe down to refresh your inbox.
- Swipe down or right to move to the next object on the screen.
- Double-tap to select an object.

Change text size

To change the text size for Gmail, change the font size for your Android device.

- 1. Open your device's Settings app.
- 2. Tap **Display** Font size.

iPhone & iPad

You can use VoiceOver screen reader with the Gmail app on iPhones and iPads.

Step 1: Turn on VoiceOver

If you haven't already turned on VoiceOver, visit the Apple help site for instructions.

Step 2: Use VoiceOver

Once VoiceOver is on, you can navigate in Inbox using standard iPhone or iPad VoiceOver gestures.
