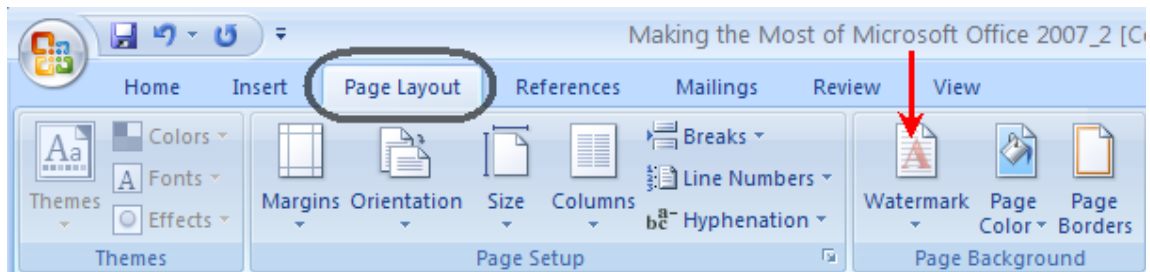


**Watermarks:** Add a pale image or wording that appears behind text on each page of a document.

## Presidential Anecdotes



**Gerald R. Ford:** On a trip to Oregon, Vice-President Ford stopped at Utah State to see his son Jack. When he reached the campus a crowd of students gathered, and he started making remarks. As he went down the line, he took the hand of a bearded fellow who, as Ford continued shaking hands, began to smile. It was Jack. He had grown such a crop of whiskers that his father did not recognize him.<sup>6</sup>

**Ronald Reagan (1961-1969):** Reagan turned seventy in February 1961 and joked about his age in a speech at a Washington Press Club dinner. "I know your organization was founded by six Washington newspaperwomen in 1919," he remarked; then, after a slight pause, added, "It seems like only yesterday."
